Uline Arena
1140 Third St, NE

Architect: Antunovich Assoc.
Built: 1941
Type: Mixed-Use
Planned Redevelopment

Douglas Development is collaborating with Antunovich Associates to transform the historic Uline Arena building into 150,000 square feet of office space and 50,000 square feet of retail.



One NoMa Station
131 M St, NE

Architect: Ai Engineers
Built: 1939
Redeveloped: 2005
Type: Office + Retail

Designated as a District of Columbia Historic Landmark, the Woodward & Lothrop Service Warehouse was converted in 2005 into a 400,000 square feet Class A office space and retail.



NPR Headquarters
1111 North Capitol St, NE

Architect: Hickok Cole Architects
Built: 1926
Redevelopment: 2013
Type: Office/ Media

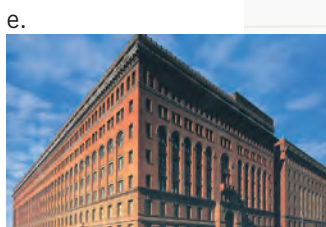
NPR's new headquarters at 1111 North Capitol Street, NE is a 330,000 sq. ft. building featuring a four-story 1926 historic warehouse, the façade of which was preserved, combined with a new seven-story office tower.



Landmark Lofts
215 I St, NE

Architect/ Engineer: MEI
Type: Residential
Built: 1870's
Redeveloped: 2008

A 19th century convent that later served as the Capitol Children's Museum was converted into 44 high-end condominium units.



United States Government Printing Office (GPO)
732 N. Capitol St, NE

Architect: James G. Hill
Built: 1903
Type: Government facility

The current GPO building was constructed on land south of the former complex that was built in 1857. GPO has continued to operate in the Romanesque-Revival building from 1903 till today.



Union Station
50 Massachusetts Ave, NE

Architect: Daniel H. Burnham
Built: 1907
Type: Train Station

Visited by 40 million people per year, Daniel H. Burnham's Union Station features triumphal arches and vaulted spaces adorned in marble, gold leaf, and white granite.
